

Lathrop Appointed Managing Editor Of Fall Messenger

*Present Friday Assistant Editor To Be Head
Announces Brier About Spokane Transfer*

Corinne Lathrop, present Friday assistant editor, has been appointed to the position of Managing Editor for next fall's Garfield Messenger, according to H. M. Brier, journalism adviser.

Corinne has recently been made a member of Quill and Scroll, National Journalistic Honorary for high school journalists. She was given this honor for her work on the staff.

The new managing editor came to Garfield from North Central High in Spokane last November. There she was a member of the Scriptorians, a club for writers, president of the school's service council, and a contributor to the Youth Page, a page in the city paper devoted to the work of high school students.

In February, 1939, the Garfield Messenger saw its first Managing Editor in Mary Barton. Under Mary were Mildred Madland and Barton Robbins, editors. In the fall of 1939 Barbara Holmes was appointed to the position of Managing Editor with editors Arnold Pearson and Jeanne Brigham. In February 1940, John Dickinson was in charge with Kay Skinner and Dick Marble as his editors. Last fall Kay Skinner was the head with Betty Fairburn and Jack Corbally as her editors.

This semester Jack Corbally, managing editor, has had for his editors Van Marshall and Charles Nelson.
